Marianna Wimberley, 87, of Kearney died Wednesday, February 21, 2018 at Country House Residence in Kearney.

Marianna Parish Wimberley was born August 22, 1930 in Auburn, Nebraska and grew up in Elmwood, NE, one of five children. She met Wally Wimberley in Lincoln, at the end of WWII, and they were married August 26, 1950. After living in Aberdeen SD and Columbus NE they settled in Kearney and lived here for the rest of their lives, raising three children. She was preceded in death by her husband, and survived by her three children, eight grandchildren, five great grandchildren, one sister and two brothers.

While managing the children and the house, Marianna went back to school at Kearney State College and completed a degree in English and a secondary teaching certification. After her children entered high school, she taught in the Sumner-Eddyville-Miller School District and then worked at the Educational Service Unit in Kearney. Few things were more important to Marianna than education and she was dedicated to her students. She was a flawless grammarian and was tireless in correcting her own children, students and the world at large.

Marianna and Wally loved people and always had the coffeepot on for friends and family who stopped by often to visit. They had a wide circle of friends and played golf, were enthusiastic scrabble players and members of the Kearney Dance Club. Marianna's enthusiasms were endless—she enjoyed art, theater, music, birds and good jokes. She was a docent at the Museum of Nebraska Art, an usher for performances at the Merryman

Performing Arts Center and a volunteer at Rowe Sanctuary, where her love of people and birds found a perfect outlet.

Marianna cared deeply for people and always helped friends and family who were ill or in need. She was a person whose life and actions defined community. We miss her—her spirit lives on in everyone whose lives she touched.
