Ryan G. Roper, 40, of Kearney, passed away October 23rd at CHI hospital in Kearney. He was surrounded by family and friends. A gathering will be held from 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Saturday, November 17th at Old Town Hall (1900 Central Avenue, Kearney) to celebrate Ryan's life. He had a smile that was infectious and an especially unique personality. There was never a dull moment when Ryan was around. He was an amazing father, big brother, uncle and friend. He was so loved and will be missed deeply.
