“ Billy Bob was always a fun classmate in Kindergarten, then 7th-12th; when we were in Junior High and High School I returned to Central. I was sent to North Grade School after Kindergarten to the new school, because we lived in the country East of Newel...then known as the Callaway Road. When we were in Kindergarten there was no drainage ditch on the East side of Newel, so Billy Bob and Mark Whaley would come out to the farm on nice afternoons. Dad would come in the house and say that he could see two little guys coming across the alfalfa field. They would run a little ways, and then drop down in the alfalfa so we couldn't see them. I don't think they were coming to see me, but loved to come out and spend time on the farm. We could find lots to do, Dad would help them with things or show them how things were done, and Mother always had treats. Plus, I had an older brother, who was in Betty's class, who liked to have company as well.

Once in a while, I would play at the Mortuary after school with Billy Bob. We had to be more careful what rooms we entered. It was always fun and his Mother had nice treats, too.

Bill's great grandmother and my great grandmother were sisters. They were Hawley until they were married. My great grandmother was Mary Ellen Hawley Bartlett.
