



## Antonio R. De La Torre

Antonio De La Torre, 100 years of age, of Kearney, passed away May 21, 2026, at Good Samaritan Society – St. John's in Kearney. A funeral mass will be 10:30 am, May 26, 2026, at St. James Catholic Church followed by burial at Kearney Cemetery. A wake service will be 5:00 pm, May 25, 2026, at St. James Catholic Church followed by visitation until 7:00 pm. Memorials are suggested to the family to be designated later.

Antonio was born in Taft, Texas, to Eusebio and Matilda De La Torre. On May 27, 1944, Antonio married Edith Rivera in Grand Island, Nebraska, and together they built a loving family and life centered on faith, hard work, and community. They raised seven children and spent most of their lives in Kearney, Nebraska, where they were devoted members of St. James Parish.

Antonio was a proud Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus and generously dedicated countless hours volunteering for both the church and the community. He enjoyed a long career with Union Pacific Railroad, working as a foreman before retiring after more than 30 years of service.

Antonio loved traveling throughout the United States, visiting other countries, and making a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. He and Edith celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City, a cherished memory for their family. He also enjoyed fishing, woodworking,

and especially spending time with his grandchildren, who always treasured their visits with him. Antonio never knew a stranger and was well known for his warm personality and witty sense of humor.

He is survived by his daughters, Theresa Salazar, Esther De La Torre-Maes (Ernie), and Yolanda Herron (Tom); his sons, Anthony De La Torre (Darci), Daniel De La Torre (Penny), and Carlos De La Torre; sixteen grandchildren; twenty-four great-grandchildren; and one great-great-grandchild.

He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Edith De La Torre, his daughter, Josephine Schuman, son-in-law Antonio Salazar.
