Benjamin Herman Pahl was born on a farm near Eddy, Oklahoma, September 12, 1921, the second child of Fred John Pahl and Gertrude Mary Ritter Pahl.

Ben was a student at the University of Nebraska Dental College when WWII began. His class was the only one to complete the entire curriculum in three years. After graduation, he served in the Navy before moving to Kearney, where he practiced for 42 years. He retired in September 1989 to pursue his hobbies of building radio-controlled airplanes, fishing, hunting, golfing, woodworking, gardening and yard work. He and Billie moved to North Platte, NE in 2012 to be nearer their daughter.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 69 years, Eula (Billie) Warehime

Pahl, his parents, a brother, Harvey Ritter Pahl and a sister Juanita June Pahl Frost.
