



## Bradley "Brad" W. Bigelow

November 1, 1936 - May 29, 2024

Bradley "Brad" W. Bigelow, age 87, of Kearney, passed away on Wednesday, May 29, 2024 at Brookstone Gardens in Kearney. Visitation will be at Horner Lieske McBride & Kuhl in Kearney on Friday, May 31st, 2024 from 5:00 pm -7:00 pm. A Celebration of Life will be held on Saturday, June 1, 2024 at 11:00 am at First Lutheran Church in Kearney, preceded by burial at the Kearney Cemetery at 9:30 am. Rev. Dr's. Dr. Brad W. Bigelow, 87, of Kearney passed away on Wednesday, May 29th in Kearney where he had lived and served since 1968.

Brad was born on November 1, 1936 in Omaha, NE to Forrest and Anna Rohde Bigelow and grew up as an only child on 80 acres in Burt County in NE Nebraska. Farming didn't hold an interest for Brad, but he was in 4-H a number of years and raised Duroc sows. Brad's Family Farm was awarded a Knights of Aksarben Pioneer Farm Award, representing 100 (now 125) years of Bigelow Family ownership. Brad describes his farmhouse as "4 rooms and a path – our house had no running water but our hogs did".

Brad skipped two grades in his country school and graduated at 16 from Lyons High School in 1953. Of the decision for him to move up two grades, he said “that was a dubious decision at best, even though I now believe that it had a significant impact on all the great life experiences that have followed.” An excellent athlete, he played Midget, Legion and Town baseball as a pitcher. Despite the back problems that he attributed to hauling and stacking hay in his youth, he remained an athlete and sportsman until his early 80s. Brad also played the piano beautifully and as a Saxophonist, was in a band “The Kings Men” that played in small venues and on college campuses around Wayne State College.

At Wayne, Brad served as Editor of both the student newspaper Goldenrod and the yearbook Spizz. Journalism, tennis and theater were a big part of his years there. It is at Wayne that he met his future wife, Karen Johnson. They were married in Akron, Iowa on August 17th, 1958.

Brad earned his BA in education from Wayne State in 1957. He earned his master’s in education/clinical psychology in 1958 and doctorate in educational psychology 1964, both from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. In 2011, Brad was presented the Wayne State Alumni Achievement Award and was a trustee for the Wayne State Foundation. He also established the Brad Bigelow endowed Criminal Justice Scholarship at Wayne State. He enjoyed hearing from and meeting his student recipients each year and hearing their stories.

He became the first psychologist for the Nebraska Penal and Correctional complex in 1960 and served as the chief psychologist until 1968. He co-hosted a one-hour monthly TV series, The Prisoner Speaks, on Channels 10-11, and originated Project Youth, a panel of inmates that spoke to various schools, civic and religious groups around the state.

Brad later served as psychologist/program director at Kearney Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Center from 1968 until retirement 1998. He created the State of Nebraska Evaluation Program for pre-adjudicated adolescent male offenders. Brad maintained his private practice until age 85 when he finally retired. He served as psychological consultant to Vocational Rehabilitation Services, Veterans Affairs, Mosaic Developmental Disabilities, school districts, the courts, and the Department of Health and Human Services. He served as a supervisor for mental health practitioners in Hastings and North Platte until 2017.

He was the co-founder of the Kearney Friends Program (Big Brothers/Big Sisters); co-founder and board member of Campus House Group Home for Girls; co-founder and former president of Nebraska Juvenile Justice Association (recipient of the association's Service to Youth Award in 1986 and 1998); and cofounder, former president of South Central Behavioral Service. He was present at Buffalo County Mental Health Board meetings until 2023 where he served for years as a board member. He also served on the Governor's Behavioral Health Oversight Committee.

Brad's practice covered the entire state of Nebraska. He was only one of a few psychologists who saw referrals in their own homes. To his knowledge, Brad was the longest practicing clinician in the state, having performed in excess of 30,000 evaluations during his career. As he said "I never turned anyone down." A lot of people didn't want to see him but they were required to in order to get Social Security benefits. He would tell them, "I am going to be your new best friend for the next few hours."

Work did not consume Brad's days. He devoted time to his wife and daughters, friends, and cherished time with his grandkids. He was an avid hunter, fisherman, golfer, reader and storyteller. A few days before his

passing, and article about a book Brad wrote in the last months of his life “Didja Hear the One About” appeared in the Kearney Hub. It was full of his famous “play on word” jokes and stories from his career and its characters, and as he said “I couldn’t make this stuff up!” He loved his family “my reason”, and was a faithful friend.

The family that loved him included his wife of 65 years, Karen; daughters Lisa Kurtz and husband Jeff, of Overland Park, KS; LeAnn Welsh of Omaha, NE; grandchildren John Kurtz and wife Jennie Hayes Kurtz of Nashville, TN; Molly Holmes and husband Ryan, Denver, CO; Sarah Welsh, London, UK; Claire Welsh, Denver, CO; Jack Welsh, Omaha, NE; and great-granddaughters Nellie and Josie Holmes.
