Freddie L. "Fred" Gewecke, 75, of Elm Creek died Wednesday, July 12, 2017 at his home in Elm Creek.

Funeral services will be Tuesday, July 18, 2017 at 10:30 a.m. at the Elm Creek United Methodist Church. Rev. Doug Gahn will officiate. There will be no visitation, the casket will be closed. Burial with Military Rites provided by the Kearney American Legion Post #52, Kearney V.F.W. He was a member of the Elm Creek United Methodist Church and the Elm

Creek Lions Club. He enjoyed attending auctions and was an avid collector. He enjoyed visiting with family and friends.

Surviving relatives include his brother, Vern Gewecke of Amherst, NE and sister, June Reiners and husband Marlin of Juniata, NE. He is also survived by 7 nieces, 10 nephews and many great nieces, nephews and a host of friends.
