Helen M. Baker, 92, of Kearney, NE died Thursday, September 26, 2019 at Brookdale Kearney Northridge assisted living facility. She then attended Kearney State Teachers College where she earned a teaching degree. Helen taught school for 7 years and later accepted a position as a Secretary at the college. She married Gordon L. Baker on September 30, 1947 in Elm Creek, NE. Gordon enlisted in the Marine Corps shortly after their wedding and the couple would reside in Cherry Point, NC while he was stationed there. After the Marines, Helen and Gordon moved to Elm Creek, NE where they owned and operated Baker's Standard Service and Baker's Skelly. They moved to Kearney in 1976 after Gordon took a position as Grounds Supervisor at UNK. Helen was a member of the Kearney First United Methodist Church and a past member of Women's Church Circle. She enjoyed reading, crocheting and spending time with her family.
