Morris R. Geiser, 92, of Kearney died Monday, September 11, 2017 at his home in Kearney.

He was a member of First United Methodist Church in Kearney. He was an active member of the Methodist Men and Crusaders Sunday School class at the church. Morris enjoyed camping with his family. He was very proud of his family and enjoyed watching them grow. He was very intelligent, thoughtful, hard working and kind. His greatest joy was putting others before himself.
