Richard "Dick" P. Madsen, age 76 of Litchfield, NE passed away on Thursday, July 31, 2025 at CHI Health – St. Francis in Grand Island, NE. 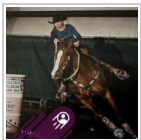
