Robert "Bob" Eugene Bragg, age 92, of Kearney, passed away on Saturday, June 20, 2020 at his home in Kearney. Private family memorial services will be at Living Faith Fellowship Church in Kearney. On June 6, 1948, he married Dorothy Williams. He worked in sales for Sears Roebuck and Co for thirty years and subsequently as business manager for Kearney Public Schools, retiring in 1990. He was a member of Living Faith Fellowship church, active in the church and community, serving on many committees, boards and in numerous leadership roles, including seventeen years on the KPS school board.
