Martin bomber plant in Omaha. She joined the Navy in 1944 and served during WW II. She was stationed at the naval station in Quansit Point, Rhode Island where she was an Aerographer's Mate 3rd Class. She taught grade school at Bryant Elementary School. She married Richard Gellerman on May 27, 1957 in Kearney. They farmed south of Wilcox for one year, and then moved north of Kearney where they farmed. Richard passed away in 1994. She was a member of the St. James Catholic Church and the Kearney American Legion Auxiliary. She enjoyed gardening, growing roses, raising chickens, and bible study.
