“ *Walt was a cool guy. He had such a wonderful laugh. Back before Walt and Lois moved to Council Bluffs Dad, Mom and I would go to Omaha for a visit and we somehow managed to fit all 5 of us into that tiny trailer they had. I don't recall where I slept but probably on the floor. It was an all-in-1 trailer, bed, kitchen, living room just one big room, no dividers. Lois would get out her accordion and play and Walt would "dance". I recall once Walt stepped on a piece of rebar and it went through his foot. He hobbled around for a long time, no dancing for a long while for him. Walt must have been in the 7th or 8th grade when my mom (Marjorie Cook Pflaum) taught him in school. I don't know if she taught Helen or not but I know Walt would make comments to my mom sometimes about how she was a good teacher but he was a bad student. Walt and Lois were very good people. I know you all will miss him.*
